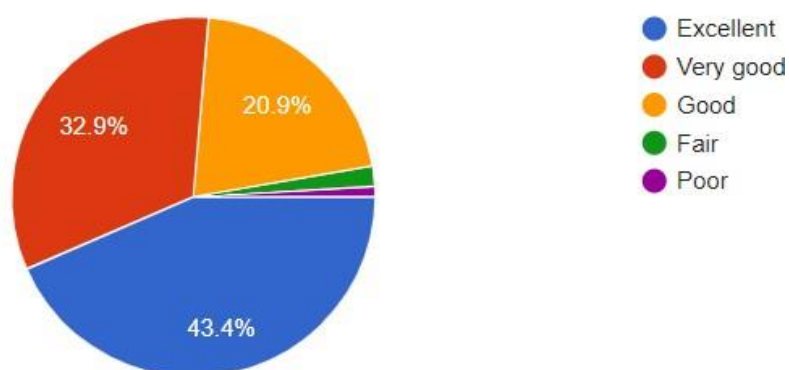

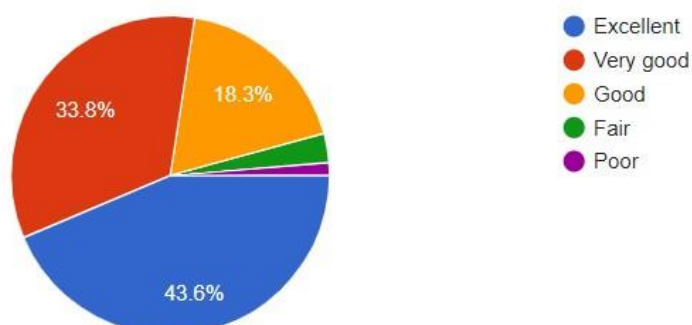

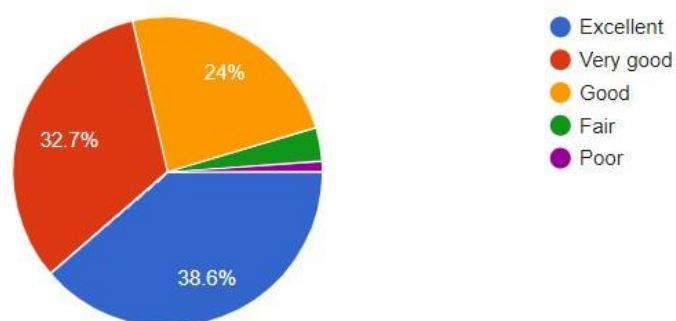
How do you rate the teaching faculty of the college regarding the proficiency in the subject taught, preparation for the class, communication skill etc.?

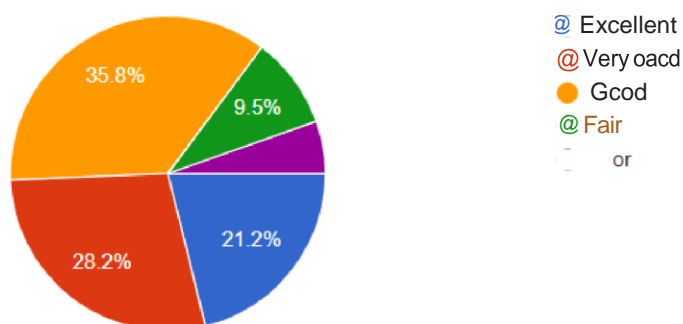
How do you rate the infrastructure facilities like class rooms, library, laboratories etc. in the college?

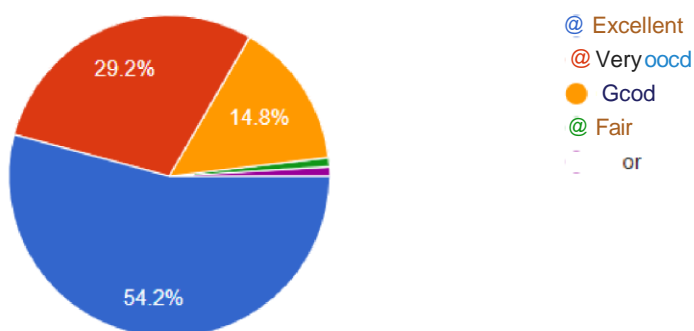
How do you rate the e-learning resources of the college such as computers, internet connectivity, smart class rooms etc.?

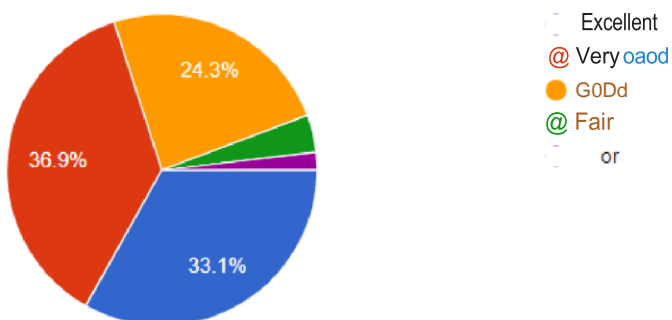
How do you rate the extension activities of NCC, NSS and other clubs?

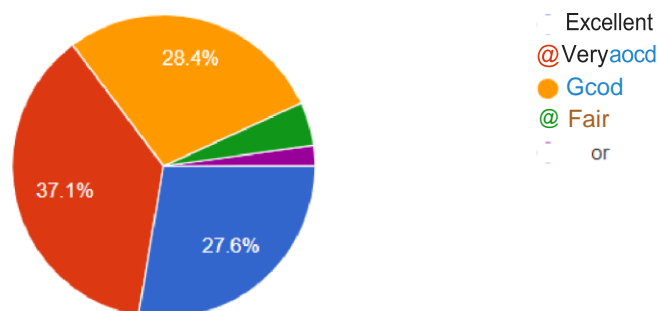
How do you rate the communications of the college office as a link between the college and the affiliating University?

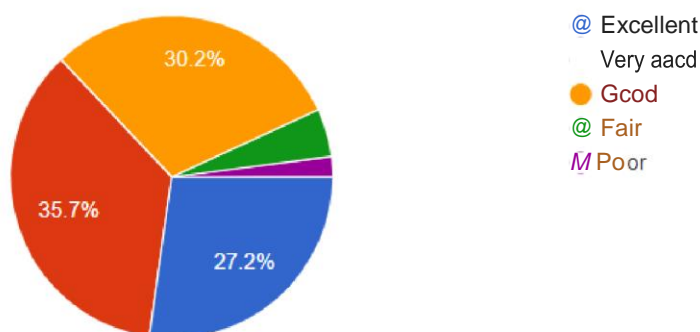
How do you rate the assessment and evaluation system of the college to ensure outcome based education?

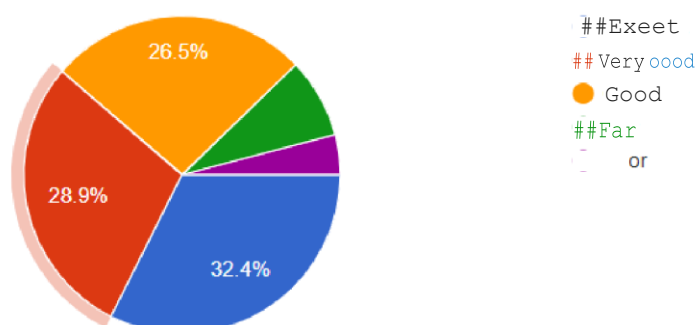
How do you rate the student progression and monitoring system of the college?

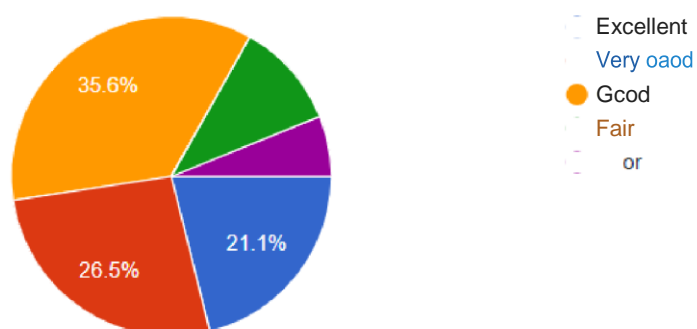
How do you rate the functioning of various clubs such as Nature club (Neithal), Film club, Literary club (Koodu), Music club etc.?

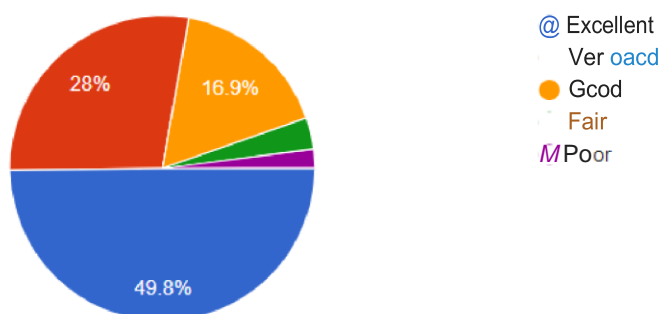
How do you rate the functioning of Parents Teacher Association(PTA) of the college?

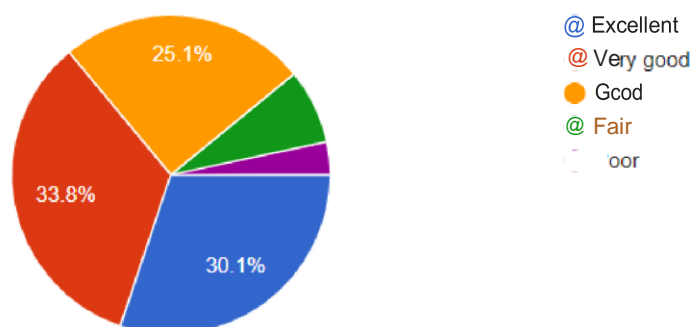
How do you rate the physical education facilities and sports activities of the college?

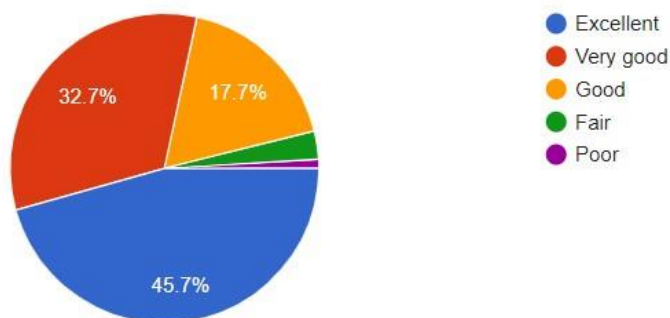
How do you rate the green initiatives of the college such as organic farming, plastic free campus etc.?

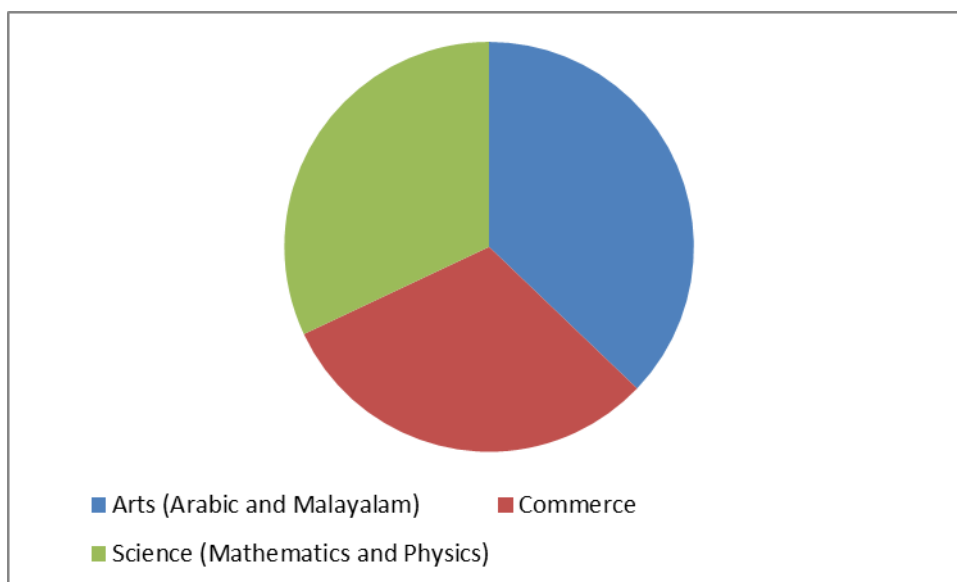

Summary of report

1. Regarding how much of the syllabus was covered in the class, majority (62.3%) responded that 85 % to 100% are covered.27.4% opined that 70 to 84% portions are covered.

2. On the question how well did the teachers prepare for the classes, 37.7% opined about thorough preparation and 58.9% about satisfactory level preparations.

3. Majority view the communication skill of teachers as always effective and sometimes effective.

4. The teacher's approach to teaching was best be described as excellent and very good by the students

5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers: 53.1% view it as always fair and 38.9% view as usually fair

6. Most of the students viewed that their performance in assignments were discussed with them.

7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, and field visit opportunities for students.

37.7% viewed the interest as regular,.29.7% as regular and 19.4% as interest sometimes.

8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.

33.1% viewed the teaching and mentoring process help growth significantly and 49.7% as very well.

44.6% opined that there are full encouragement and 34.9% opined about reasonable encouragement and 14.3% opined about partial encouragement.

35.4% strongly agree, 46.3% agree and 16.6% are neutral

42.3 viewed it present to a great extent, 44% as moderate and 6.3% as somewhat present.

41.1% agree to a great extent, 44.6% moderately and 7.45% somewhat.

34.9% viewed that above 90% teachers use ICT tools, 30.9% opined that it is 70 to 89%, 18.9% viewed it as 50 to 69% and 8.45% viewed it as 30 to 49%.

50.9% strongly agree, 39.4% agree, 8.6% is neutral and 1.14% disagree that overall quality of teaching learning process is very good.
